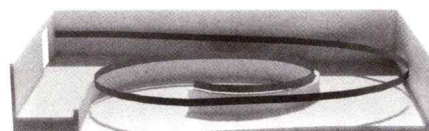
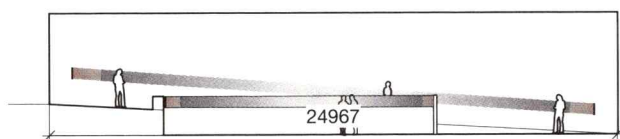




The Njál's Saga Tapestry Exhibition Complex in Hvolsvöllur, Iceland



The town of Hvolsvöllur, one and a half hours east of the capital city of Reykjavík, is conveniently located on Iceland's Ring Road highway.

Here the permanent exhibition space for the tapestry exhibit will be built, not only in a location convenient for tourism, but most significantly in the heart of Njál's Saga country. From the permanent exhibition space, significant saga sites are short walks, rides, or drives away.

The permanent exhibition space exhibit is being designed by Icelandic architect, Kristín Brynja Gunnarsdóttir. Kristín Brynja incorporates concepts inherent in the construction of the tapestry, such as spooling and unfolding, to create a design that will invite and inform the viewer, as well as echoing the history of the embroidery experience.

The exhibit complex will also include a gift and coffee shop, spaces for continuing education, embroidery workshops and musical performances all surrounded by the wonder of the tapestry.

The permanent exhibition space will be 400 square meters (4300 square feet) at least. Plans for construction and groundbreaking are underway. Completion of the exhibit is slated for June 2027.
